Keynote Speaker



The Honorable Nancy Johnson
Former Connecticut Congresswoman
Senior Public Policy Advisor, Baker Donelson

After serving 24 years in the U.S. Congress, Nancy Johnson joined Baker Donelson because she shares the Firm's commitment to service excellence. She served 18 years on the House Ways and Means Committee and played an integral role in the passage of every major tax, trade and health care initiative during years of rapid technological and political change and the globalization of the economy. Ms. Johnson is widely recognized for her acumen and sound analyses of healthcare, tax and trade policies. She is a powerful advocate on these issues for the Firm's clients.

Ms. Johnson's legislative record is a testament to her strategic expertise and ability to build coalitions. She has been recognized frequently for her leadership on such disparate issues as manufacturing, health policy, fair tax and trade policy, child and family issues and the environment.

Ms. Johnson is an authority on health policy and as such, a key member of any team seeking to negotiate policies governing Medicare or developing a universally accessible health care system. As a member and then Chairwoman of the Ways and Means Health Subcommittee, she introduced the national Children's Health Insurance Program and was a principal author of the Medicare Modernization Act. Her many years of service have given her a deep knowledge of the health care delivery system, including the need for systems change, quality measurement and payment reform to improve quality and efficiency.

She introduced the health information technology legislation that led to the establishment of the Office of the National Coordinator for Health Information Technology (HIT) and continues to fight for broad adoption of HIT to reduce medical errors and improve care quality. Her broad knowledge of the many challenges in this area, from deployment to privacy and security issues, enable Ms. Johnson and the Baker Donelson health policy team to guide and represent those interested and affected by technology and systems change in the health sector.

As the Chairman of the House Ways and Means Oversight Subcommittee, Ms. Johnson authored a series of taxpayer rights bills that provided protections for individuals and small businesses and passed legislation to implement the recommendations of the commission to reorganize the IRS to modernize consumer services and enhance agency accountability.

Ms. Johnson is helping clients to anticipate proposals and influence changes in tax law and to meet upcoming challenges in the trade arena. Having served on the Ways and Means Committee when major changes in tax law were adopted under both Democratic and Republican leaderships, she is helping Baker Donelson clients to understand and influence the significant changes to tax policy that are on the congressional agenda. In the past, in support of manufacturing and small business, Ms.

Johnson focused on tax incentives for investment and authored the alternative research and development credit, as well as other provisions to improve U.S. competitiveness and stimulate growth.

Ms. Johnson worked for passage of trade negotiating authority, agreements expanding market access, and laws strengthening enforcement of intellectual property rights, anti-dumping and other fair trade initiatives. In addition, throughout her service on the Ways and Means Committee, she led many reforms of our pension laws, created the Simple Plan for small businesses, helped pass numerous tax incentives to encourage personal savings and co-led passage of the landmark Portman-Cardin senior reform.

Tod Ibrahim is Executive Director of the American Society of Nephrology, which represents nearly 15,000 kidney care professionals in more than 110 countries. Prior to this position, he was founding Executive Vice President of the Alliance for Academic Internal Medicine, Director of Public Policy for the Association of Professors of Medicine, Director of Communications for Robert Betz Associates, and Staff Assistant for US Representative Thomas C. Sawyer (D-OH). A two-time recipient of George Washington University's Jenny McKean Moore scholarship for poets, Tod has a master's degree in liberal arts from Johns Hopkins University and a bachelor's degree in English from the University of Maryland at College Park.

He is the author or coauthor of many articles, including "The Kidney Research Predicament"; "Recruiting the Next Generation of Nephrologists"; "The Future Nephrology Workforce: Will There Be One?"; "The Impact of Increasing Medical School Class Size on Clinical Clerkships: A National Survey of Internal Medicine Clerkship Directors"; "Tenures for Department Chairs: How Short Is Too Short?"; "Globalization: A New Dimension for Academic Internal Medicine"; "Centers, Institutes, and the Future of Clinical Departments"; and "Developing a Strategy for Providing Federal GME Support." Recently, Tod coauthored a chapter for the *Guidebook for Clerkship Directors* entitled "Understanding, Navigating, and Leveraging US Medicine."



Glenda Payne, M.S., R.N., C.N.N., is Director of Clinical Services at Nephrology Clinical Solutions. She consults in all areas of nephrology for corporations, facilities and individuals including education on topics related to regulatory compliance, patient safety, quality assessment and performance assessment. She has been a respected and visionary ANNA leader for many years, as an active member serving as legislative advisor and a member of the Leadership Development Committee. Most recently, Glenda served as ANNA's National President 2012-2013.

She has been a nephrology nurse for more than 30 years, committed to both quality and patient care, with a broad range of professional experience in the clinical, transplant and research areas. Glenda was also instrumental in developing state licensing requirements for dialysis facilities in Texas. Previously, she worked as the End Stage Renal Disease Technical Advisor for the Survey and Certification Branch of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, Dallas Regional Office and as a project officer in the Division of Quality Improvement. She received her bachelors and masters degrees from Texas Woman's University in Denton, TX.

Glenda is the recipient of many awards including "Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services Administrator's Special Citation Award", 2010, "Lifetime Achievement Award in Nephrology Nursing," University of Missouri 2009, "Outstanding Contribution to the American Nephrology Nurse's Association (ANNA)", 2006, Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services "Administrator's Cornerstone Award", 2008 and many others for her nursing, leadership and administrative expertise.



Nancy L. Scott is an ordained minister, registered nurse and an experienced medical administrator who worked at Montclair Community Hospital in Montclair, New Jersey for over 20 years. There she served as Coordinator for Case Management for oncology, nephrology, rheumatoid arthritis, anti-infective and cardiovascular markets, ensuring strategy and medical standards and identifying patient expectations. She was noted for her leadership and development and implementation of rigorous quality control measures.

Nancy was an in-center hemodialysis patient from being diagnosed with kidney disease in 2004 until receiving a kidney transplant in the spring of 2011. She is now President of the Board of Directors for Dialysis Patient Citizens (DPC) Education Center with past involvement in DPC as a Patient Ambassador, Secretary of the Board, Vice President and President of the Board. As President of the DPC Education Board, she serves with DPC to improve the quality of life for all dialysis patients through education and advocacy. DPC is a nationwide, non-profit, patient-led organization with membership open only to dialysis and pre-dialysis patients and their families. Before joining the Board in 2007, Nancy received the DPC Hero Award.

Beyond her DPC involvement, Nancy also serves as a patient representative of Advisory Board at ESRD Network 4 and Chair of the Board of Directors at Henrietta Johnson Medical Center where she was previously chair of the Clinical Evaluation Committee. She also established a support group to encourage better communication between clinic staff and patients, and has traveled to Washington, D.C., to meet with lawmakers.

Nancy received her B.S./M.S. in Healthcare Administration at the University of Phoenix in Phoenix, Arizona and is presently enrolled there in a Doctoral Program in Industrial Organizational Psychology.



Cherilyn Cepriano, J.D., CAE, joined the Kidney Care Council (KCC), the national trade association representing dialysis providers, as Executive Director in 2009. In this capacity Cherilyn provides strategic leadership and management across all association activities. As a coalition focused on advancing public policy goals, Cherilyn leads all KCC advocacy programs,

directing a team of lobbying and analytic professionals to tackle complex healthcare policy issues including those relating to Medicare reimbursement through the End Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) Prospective Payment System (PPS), Quality Incentive Program (QIP), and development of health care exchanges under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

Cherilyn took the helm of the KCC during a critical time for dialysis providers – joining prior to the start of the ESRD PPS - and has led the provider coalition's legislative and regulatory response to ongoing policy proposals to develop, implement, and alter the emergent ESRD PPS.

Cherilyn brings to KCC more than fifteen years of experience in health policy and association management. Prior to joining KCC, Cherilyn served as Executive Director for the Emergency Department Practice Management Association (EDPMA), the national healthcare trade association representing emergency department physician groups and their business partners, and Legislative Associate for Health Policy with the National Governors' Association.

Cherilyn earned her law degree from George Mason University School of Law and a bachelor's in Government and Anthropology from Smith College, where she subsequently served as a member of the Board of Trustees. As an active member of the American Society of Association Executives (ASAE), Cherilyn has achieved the designation of Certified Association Executive (CAE), a credential held by fewer than five percent of association executives nationwide.



Rachel Nell Meyer is the Manager of Policy and Government Affairs at the American Society of Nephrology and oversees the society's federal legislative and regulatory advocacy portfolio. Meyer administers ASN's patient care and research-related advocacy efforts, working with Congress as well as federal agencies including the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, the Food and Drug Administration, and the National Institutes of Health to influence policies that affect nephrology health professionals and the patients they serve.

Prior to joining ASN, she conducted healthcare research at the Advisory Board Company in Washington, DC, and worked for Senator Ken Salazar (D-CO) in his district office. Meyer has a degree in Global Health and Development from the Colorado College.

She has co-authored numerous articles, including "Fostering Innovation, Advancing Patient Safety: The Kidney Health Initiative"; "Comparing Mandated Health Care Reforms: The Affordable Care Act, Accountable Care Organizations, and the Medicare ESRD Program"; and "Considering an Integrated Nephrology Care Delivery Model: Six Principles for Quality."
